Aumama is a Karachi-based emerging artist who graduated from the University of Karachi with a Bachelor's in Fine Arts. She works with both digital media and traditional mediums. She has an intense fascination with the sky and clouds, which began with her childhood experience of losing her twin sister. When she was five, whenever she would ask her mother about her sister, her mother lovingly respond 'She's up in the sky, with AllahTala' from that point on, her habit of gazing at the sky and seeing the clouds as a way of communicating with her sister. This connection deepened after the loss of her grandfather, leading her to believe that both her sister and grandfather are in the sky. The sky and its eer-changing clouds symbolize continuity and connection for Aumama, reflecting her thoughts and emotions. Her work captures these feelings, creating a personal world where time stands still while the outside world rushes by.

Biography

Aumama is a Karachi-based fine artist who is currently works as a corporate lecturer at Jinnah University for Women, Karachi. She specializes in oil painting and also works in charcoal and oil mediums. Her interests lie in realism. Her exhibitions include the 19th Emerging Talent at VM Art Gallery (January 2024), The Grand Art Fest at Port Grand Karachi (February 2024), and Repairing Reminiscences by Vasl (June 2024). In November 2022, She worked on the first chapter of a book called "Manachi: These Kingdoms Never Slept" with Our Shared Culture and Heritage Heritage (an international collaboration of State bank Pakistan between young people in Karachi and Manchester), also her work was showcased at Sambara Art Gallery. 


I look for fragments of visual illusions in the perception of reality, which I believe, are a crucial part of our true perception, however, exist not as a norm and come to our perception in bits and pieces. They get their purest embodiments in the form of visual arts and magic. Illusionists and artists create illusions by culminating knowledge about the mind and use errors that our mind makes in the form of perceptual deceptions to aw the viewer's mind, and so do I. This bizarre relation between illusion and true perceptions indicates the discourse of reality to be inherently mysterious, ambiguous, vague, elusive, and deceptive. That is what I am trying to capture in my work based on my experiences. The map that my mind constructs is questioned with every shift and change of belief or perspective for that time I feel like I am in an endless maze. The alienation that I feel for my own thinking and acting patterns with the changed reality is something that appalls me. It is ironic to know that there is not just one reality but multiple, in a continuous flux of time and space. But at the same time, this despair generates a new form of hope, a hope to respect all forms of reality.

Similar to illusions, uncertainty is not a norm per say. Uncertainty cannot be a constant state, though change is constant- it provides a period of certainty for the new to be fully attained and then brings back the time of chaos and repeats. This vicious cycle of construction and destruction of realities within oneself in a lifetime and in the collective consciousness of humans remain core concern in my practice while I try to find more ways to express them.


I particularly use paradox illusion in my drawings; images that by definition cannot exist in real life, however, one can find hints of their existence in the nooks and canny of architectural spaces and that is my source of inspiration that usually gives my drawings a structure. Transforming lines, planes, shapes, light, and shadows into forms and vice-versa is added, to give a glimpse of how reality is in a constant process of change and uncertainty. By investigating the grid, I conceptually and formally introduced the parallel line in my drawings. An illogical structure built on the logic of parallel lines introduces a paradox in my work. It is another way of depicting the flux of time and space as reality. By celebrating the possibility of implausible in plausible by extrapolating illusion from real-life experiences. To show that the life that is unquestionably, and undoubtedly, there, that we find reliable and believable- has an illusion concealed within its existence. As a result, I am investigating errors in unyielding reliability on our tentative epistemological abilities to claim one ultimate truth by creating illusive spaces.

Biography




Digging upside - i, 2023






